A Report on the 4th Scindia Literary Fest

The 4th Scindia Literary Fest was held in the school from 16th November to 18th November 2019. Nine reputed authors visited the Fort and coloured the environs of the school in literature, art and expression. The Opening Ceremony



for the same was held in the Assembly Hall of the School on 16th November 2019. Keshav Dudhani welcomed the gathering. Thereafter, the ceremonial lamp was lighted. The 'Saraswati Vandana' 'Veena Vadini Var Dey' invoked the blessings of Goddess Saraswati and the Orchestra Presentation in 'Rag Vrindabani Sarang' enthralled the audience. The self composed poetry by Kshitij Dogra and Jeh Hilluwala, was well received and profusely applauded. The Dean of Co-curricular Activities, Mr Dhirendra Sharma, welcomed the writers, the Chief Guest and the fest was declared open. Our Chief Guest for the day was Mr Ravindra Singh who is an author, and a software engineer. He is the best selling romance writer and he was born in the state of Odisha. He started his career as an IT professional in Infosys. He has written eight novels entitled- I Too Had a Love Story, Can Love Happen Twice?, Like it happened Yesterday, Love Stories That Touched My Heart, Tell Me A Story, Your Dreams are Mine Now, This Love That Feels Right, and Will You Still Love Me. While interacting with the students, he said that self-expression can be achieved in a variety of ways and it gives you opportunities to share the experiences of others and lets others share your views.

During the second session of the day, we met the authors- Mr Sudheer Singhal and Ms Aditi Singhal who have written a variety of books: Crack the Code-Maths Mysteries and a Memory Handbook. They started their session by



talling us about the importance of the human brain. Ma Aditi Singhal started

was a clear reflection of the diverse range of experience she possesses in the publishing industry. She introduced the boys to her recent work which is a set of two books under the title "A dozen and a half stories", which has been created by her along with Mamta Nainy as the co-author. She instantly established a connect with the audience and tickled the historian within them. She took up one of the stories from her book titled "The Peacock Throne" and explained the students how interesting history could



be. Ms Singh did not allow them to lose their interest even for a minute and encouraged the budding talents to become a "History sleuth".

Mr Laxmi Khanna Suman interacted with the students of classes VI and VII on 17th November 2019. He has authored several books comprising *ghazals, dohas* and poetry. He has also published books focusing on Children's Literature. An alumnus of IIT Roorkee in Nuclear Physics, he currently lives in Nainital and Gurgaon. He has written books in Hindi entitled- *Ajoobey, Main Bhi School Jaungi, and Chidiyon Ki Rangeen Duniya*. He picked up the



story of a poor girl Shabnam entitled-*Neele Patthar Wali Peetal Ki Angoothi* and told it to the students. After finishing with the story he asked the students to come up with the moral of the story. The students were quite interactive and came up with several answers to the question.



Mr Stephen Alter interacted with the students during the second session on 17th November 2019. He is an author of non-fiction and fiction, who was born and raised in India. He continues to live and write in his hometown of Landour in the Lower Himalaya. He graduated from Woodstock School. He has taught writing at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and at the American University in Cairo. He is the founding director of the Mussoorie Mountain Festival. His nonfiction book 'Becoming a Mountain: Himalayan Journeys in Search of the Sacred and the Sublime' received the 2015 Kekoo Naoroji Award for

Himalayan Literature. His most read novel about Jim Corbett 'In the Jungles of the Night' was shortlisted for the 2017 DSC Prize for South Asian Literature. He talked to the students about his book 'Wild Himalaya'. During the session he showed breathtaking snapshots of the wildlife and landscape of the Himalayan region. The Blue Poppy, Birch trees, the rhododendrons, Goat Antelope, and Petroglyphs from Ladakh were some of the many things that he talked about. He started the session with a short film shot in the Jabarkhet Natural Reserve, which harbours 150 species of birds. All images in the movie were taken by the animals themselves on a camera trap. Talking about the Nanda Parvat Glacier, he said that life in the Himalayas is basically an interaction between water and the rock. Mr Alter took us all through an exciting journey of the migrations within the Himalayas. He shared his travel diaries through photographs and talked about how the Himalayas are a reservoir of stories and experiences of all sorts and how the young fold mountains in the north have inspired him as a writer. He focused on the different aspects of flora and fauna and encouraged the students to 'step out of the box' to explore and discover secrets of life through nature. Students asked a variety of questions that ranged from Mr Alter's personal travel experiences to understanding what it takes to draw

with a game. Students were told to share the last two digits of their father's mobile number. Whole slide was filled with these digits. Mr Sudheer Singhal recalled all the digits one by one and Ms Aditi recalled them in the reverse order. Students were awestruck at this. Students were so engrossed in the activities that they didn't even realize that the session had ended. Mr Sudhir Singhal shared many tricks with the students to enable them remember facts and figures. Both of them created an intense interest in Mathematics.

Ms Arthy Muthanna Singh who is a children's writer, freelance journalist, copywriter, editor and cartoonist conducted a session with the boys of classes VI and VII on the first day of The Scindia Literary Fest. Her gripping session

differences in the country and how they can be resolved. He answered that if we bring compassion in our nation, like in a school, we can achieve ultimate harmony amongst all religions. He gave a very polished and lucid explanation to the issues that he has spoken about in his books. He also talked about his experiences to further talk about the above said point. The session was followed by a question and answer session. The students and the teachers put some questions to Mr Khurshid on the issues that India is facing at present like- terrorism, differences of opinion etc.

Aditya Mr Sharma interacted with the students of Class VI, VII and VIII during the first session of the day on 18th November 2019. He informed the students that he always wanted to write in English but unfortunately, he did not pursue his dreams quite early in life and therefore instructed the he students to adequately expose themselves to learning early in life. In order to pursue his dream of becoming a



writer in the English Language, he left Sonipat and went to Delhi. After that he started working for the Reader's Digest in Mumbai. He cited the reason for writing the book- Champs of Devgarh. He says that the idea presented is that one should try out many things and judge where his/ her passion lies and then, pursue ones passion to the fullest quite early in life. He talked to the students about the struggle that he faced in getting his book published. He



inspired the students by sharing with them the fact that he never gave up even after facing many rejections. His hardwork and perseverance bore fruit and his highly acclaimed book 'The Champs of Devgarh' was published by Penguin Publication. The book is loosely based on his life and traces the journey of a School- Boys' Cricket Team which faced the odds and emerged triumphant. The session ended with a question answer session.

The last session on the 18th of November 2019 was of Kevin Missal who is the best- selling author of the Kalki series. Kevin Missal is a graduate from St. Stephen's College, who has written four novels ranging from crime to mythology to horror. He had written his first book at the age of 14, which was released by the Chief Minister of Delhi. His second book was written at the age of 16 and was published by a British Indie-press. He is a pioneer in writing the World's First InstaRead and is a bestseller on Amazon under horror category. He talked about his recent book -' Narsimha'. He asked the students as to why mythological stories are not interesting for them. The students gave a variety of answers. Mr Kevin Missal explained about his journey into the mythological stories and his research about them which gave him the inspiration to write about them.





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
