The topic of the Talk House was 'Dragon v/s Elephant'. The dragon, symbolizing power and spirituality, represents China, while India is represented by the regal and divine elephant, symbolizing strength, happiness, and fortune.

In political systems, China is characterized as a communist nation, whereas India is identified as a democratic country. Communism involves the state owning most assets and striving for an egalitarian society, where people are treated equally according to their needs. On the other hand, democracy empowers the public to elect their government, placing the public's interests as one of its key priorities. China has major problems like equality, which is displayed but is not true, and people there become greedy and unfair. In China, there is a lack of nationalism, resulting in a noticeable absence of pride and love for their own country among the people. China's major asset is that people work hard but have a lower salary. India, being the most populous country, unfortunately faces a significant challenge of high unemployment rates. India has soft power, such as CEOs of big companies such as Google, Twitter, Microsoft, etc., and it is a diverse country, as we can see from the languages spoken, festivals celebrated, etc. In terms of GDP (gross domestic product), China's GDP is roughly six times greater than India's, but India is expected to surpass Germany and Japan in terms of GDP in 2028.

The question is, 'How will the elephant beat the dragon?'. As Artificial Intelligence is here to stay, India needs to digitalize, and its citizens must get jobs. The words on which India needs to focus are 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam' (derived from the Upanishads), which means the world is a family. We need to accept our diversity and not judge anyone.
