EDITORIAL

The Scindia School has been bestowed with the prestigious 'Best Education Brand' award by the Economic Times for consecutive two years in a row. Lt Col (Retd.) D K Farashwal, Bursar, The Scindia School received the award on the behalf of the Principal. Mr Temjen Imna Along, Tourism and Higher Education Minister, Nagaland presented the prize in a ceremony. This recognition serves as a testimony to the relentless commitment of the school to provide an exceptional academic and extracurricular environment to the students.

Educational Camps

The School organized the Annual Camps for students of classes VI to XI from 22nd March to 29th March 2023. A regular feature of the school's curriculum- the educational camps, normally held in October were organized in March this year. The camps prepare the students for the 'International Award for Young People' earlier known as the 'Duke of Edinburgh Awards'. The details are hereunder-

On 22nd March 2023, 22 students of class XI along with two teachers left for the Gaj pass trek near Dharamshala. The group encountered heavy rain and storm but the villagers housed the Scindians thereby making their stay safe and memorable. The group visited Dharmshala and Mc Leod Ganj as well, to see the War memorial, Bhagsu Nag Temple and the waterfall, Buddha Monastery and Norbu Linga Institute, which has kept centuries old Tibetan Culture alive by imparting skills to nearby residents.

A group of 24 students of Class VI with four teacher escorts Pathak of class X received the 'Honorable Mention' in 'Lok Sabha'. participated in the Pachmarhi Community Service Camp from On 1st April 2023, 23 students of Class XII were shortlisted to attend 22nd March to 28th March 2023. Along with trekking to Rajendra Giri Garden, Bee Falls, Jatashankar Mahadev, Gupt Mahadev, the leadership workshop at the SOBA House. The workshop was conducted by Mr Sarabjit S. Wallia founder of 'Entendido', along Privadarshini Point, Pandava Caves, they visited many other places like Bison Lodge, Handi Kho etc. They participated in with Ms Kamakshi and Ms Pranvi. The workshop lasted for two activities like Zip Line, Sky Cycling, Rappelling, Obstacle activities, days, and each day was full of several exciting activities. The students went for a jungle safari and explored two different parts of the 623 square km area of the 'Tadoba-Andhari National Park'. They also went to Hemalkasa, a tribal hospital, a school and an animal orphanage which was started by the famous Padma Shri Baba Amte in 1973. Here the students also got to meet **Shri Prakash Amte**. He personally showed the students the animal orphanage.

On 22nd March 2023, 46 students of class X along with 5 teachers left for Goa. Jungle Walk, Scuba Diving, demonstration on a Terrarium and the visit to famous beaches were the prime attractions.

शून्य से शून्य तक

शून्य और ग्वालियर के किले का बड़ा गहरा संबंध है यहाँ रियत चतुर्भुज मंदिर में क्षेत्र के सबसे पुराने शून्य का लिखित प्रमाण विद्यमान है। यह एक शिलालेख के रूप में आज भी वहीं है। यह मंदिर भगवान विष्णू को समर्पित है। गणित का विद्यार्थी (अध्यापक) होने के नाते उसे देखने की इच्छा हुई और साथ ही इस बात पर ध्यान गया कि शून्य का लिखा होना या न लिखे होने पर क्या प्रभाव पड़ता है? साथ ही कुछ अन्य विचारों ने भी जन्म लिया, तो यहाँ पर एक ''विशेष स्थान'' ने मुझे सोचने-विचारने पर मजबूर कर दिया।

शून्य ईश्वर है या ईश्वर शून्य है या ये एक-दूसरे के पर्याय है। जिस प्रकार शून्य दिखाई नहीं देता, ईश्वर भी दिखाई नहीं देता। ईश्वर को लोगों ने अपनी-अपनी सविधानसार कुछ न कुछ मुर्त रूप



दिया है उसी प्रकार शून्य को भी मूर्त रूप दिया गया है ईश्वर का अस्तित्व उसको मानने वालों से होता है उसी प्रकार शून्य का अंकों से। दोनों ही निराकार हैं, पता नहीं कितना बडा या छोटा। मानो तो कण-कण में है शुन्य और ईश्वर। अण् -परमाणु से लेकर 'ब्लैक होल' में भी शुन्य ही है। इसकी तुलना की जा सकती है मृत्यू से। हाँ, मृत्यू के बाद जीव 'श्वास–शून्य' हो जाता है। शून्य को मैं जीवन का आरंभकर्ता भी मानता हूँ क्योंकि जब जीवन नहीं था तो विद्यमान था शून्य, तो यह अंत भी है और आरंभ भी ।

होता है उसी प्रकार बिंदु से बिंदु मिलाने पर निर्माण होता है सभी ज्यामितीय रचनाओं का। परंतु जिसका कोई आकार ही नहीं वह अन्य का निर्माण कैसे कर पाता है? तो शून्य हुआ न गणित का भगवान, जो दिखता नहीं लेकिन सब कुछ बना देता है। कैसी है यह पहेली मुझे कुछ ज्ञात भी नहीं, परंतू अज्ञात भी नहीं। शून्य, ईश्वर, बिंदु सब एक दूसरे के पर्याय ही प्रतीत होते हैं मुझे तो।

THE VINTAGE CITY - POKHARA

Summer Breaks are welcome for they carry you to a different country, a different clime and most importantly they furnish that rare opportunity to try your hands at something that you have never previously explored.

This time, summer vacation added a lot of value to the paradigm of my experiences. I love to explore new and exotic places, especially those which are so pristine and untouched by the human hand. This time I visited Nepal and to be exact- the city of Pokhara.
